- 4. 3G Artificial Grass Pitch circa £650k
- 5. Car Parking Provision
- 6. Site Access

Questions to consider

- 1. Are you looking to relocate or provide sport and leisure facilities to support a potential development proposal?
- 2. Have you identified strategic need and do you have the strategic support of Sport England (as a statutory consultee) and NGB's?
- 3. Is the site suitable for dedicated sports provision e.g. is it serviced, what are the cost and site implications, is the site future proofed?
- 4. Can you add value to your proposal (have you considered grant aid/investment, have you aligned strategic support with all partners, does the financial mix work for all)?
- 5. Have you considered all your options? Is there an alternative site or solution?

A detailed sport and leisure scoping study will answer all the above questions.
